

# Hillmorton High School (339) Enrolment Scheme Amendment commencing 6 October 2025

## Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below shall be eligible to enrol at the school.

Note that eligibility to enrol is based on the below written description of the home zone. Any associated maps are a visual representation of this description.

Addresses on both sides of boundary roads are considered in-zone unless specified otherwise.

### Year 7-8 Enrolment Scheme Home Zone:

From the Christchurch Southern Motorway / Wrights Road overpass;

- North to Jack Hinton Drive
- East along Jack Hinton Drive to Whiteleigh Avenue
- North along Whiteleigh Avenue to the Railway line
- East along the South side of the Railway line to Lincoln Road
- North East along Lincoln Road to Moorhouse Avenue / Hagley Avenue intersection
- North East along the South East side only of Hagley Avenue to Tuam Street
- East along the South side only of Tuam Street to Colombo Street
- South along the West side only of Colombo Street to Brougham Street
- West along the North side only of Brougham Street to Selwyn Street
- South along the West side only of Selwyn Street to Coronation Street
- South West along the North West side only of Coronation Street to Barrington Street
- South East along the South West side only of Barrington Street to Frankleigh Street
- South West along the North West side only of Frankleigh Street to Lyttelton Street
- South along the West side only of Lyttelton Street to Rose Street
- West along Rose Street (both sides) to Palmside Street
  - including 50 Rose Street
- South along Palmside Street to Woodbank Street
- East along Woodbank Street to Ferniehurst Street
  - including all addresses on Karaka Place, Woodbank Street, and Paikea Place
- South along Ferniehurst Street to Cashmere Road
- South along Cashmere Road to Hendersons Road
  - including all addresses on Cashmere Road between Hendersons Road and Hoon Hay Valley Road
  - including all addresses on Bushland Place and Kahika Lane
- West along Hendersons Road to Sparks Road
- South West along Sparks Road to Milns Road
  - Including all addresses on Benrogan Drive, Perks Drive and Eastman Drive
- North West along the North East side only of Milns Road to Halswell Road (SH75)
- North East along the East side only of Halswell Road (SH75) to a point that aligns with Templetons Road
- North West across to Templetons Road (both sides) to the Curletts Road Reserve / Ngā Puna Wai Sports Hub
- North West through the Reserve to the Hayton Road underpass at the Christchurch Southern Motorway (SH 76)
- East along the South side only of the Christchurch Southern Motorway to the Christchurch Southern Motorway / Wrights Road overpass.



## Year 9-13+ Enrolment Scheme Home Zone:

From the Christchurch Southern Motorway / Wrights Road overpass;

- North to Jack Hinton Drive
- East along Jack Hinton Drive to Whiteleigh Avenue
- North along Whiteleigh Avenue to the Railway line
- East along the South side of the Railway line to Lincoln Road
- North East along Lincoln Road to Moorhouse Avenue / Hagley Avenue intersection
- North East along the South East side only of Hagley Avenue to Tuam Street
- East along the South side only of Tuam Street to Colombo Street
- South along the West side only of Colombo Street to Brougham Street
- West along the North side only of Brougham Street to Selwyn Street
- South along the West side only of Selwyn Street to Coronation Street
- South West along the North West side only of Coronation Street to Barrington Street
- South East along the South West side only of Barrington Street to Frankleigh Street
- South West along the North West side only of Frankleigh Street to Lyttelton Street
- South along the West side only of Lyttelton Street to Rose Street
- West along Rose Street (both sides) to Palmside Street (including 50 Rose Street)
- South along Palmside Street to Woodbank Street
- East along Woodbank Street to Ferniehurst Street (including all addresses on Karaka Place, Woodbank Street, and Paikea Place)
- South along Ferniehurst Street to Cashmere Road
- South along Cashmere Road to the intersection with Hoon Hay Valley Road
- From the Cashmere Road / Hoon Hay Valley Road intersection, south across country to address 351 Kennedys Bush Road
- West along Kennedys Bush Road to Comer Street
  - Including The Ridge, Watlings Place, Kahiwi Place, Minsons Lane, Larnder Lane, Kapuka Lane, Stowe Lane and Hyndhope Road
- South west along Comer Street to Riverstone Drive
  - Including all addresses on Comer Street
- West, north then east along Riverstone Drive to Waterford Farm Road
  - Including Tieke Lane
- North along Waterford Farm Road to Whites Tramway Road
- West along Whites Tramway Road to Halswell Road (SH75)
- South West along Halswell Road (SH75) to Candys Road (including 640 Halswell Road)
  - Including 511 Halswell Road
- North West along Candys Road to Tuna Street
- North East along Tuna Street to Quaifes Road
- West along Quaifes Road to Whincops Road
- South along Whincops Road to Longstaffs Road (including Downies Road)
- North along Longstaffs Road to Fountains Road
- North along Fountains Road to Marshs Road
- North west along Marshs Road to Springs Road
- North along the East side only of Springs Road to the Christchurch Southern Motorway
- East along the South side only of the Christchurch Southern Motorway to the Christchurch Southern Motorway / Wrights Road overpass.

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date that will be published by public notice in a medium appropriate to the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places that can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.



## Special Programmes

Hillmorton High School operates the 'Upland Specialist Programme' for up to 35 learners with multiple disabilities, verified for the On-going Resourcing Scheme.

Upland Specialist Programme for ORS funded students

Students are supported in their individual programmes of learning in Upland classes of 5 – 10 students, in mainstream classes where appropriate, and in the local community. We employ a full-time speech language therapist, an occupational therapist and a physiotherapist when available. These staff work in collaboration with parents, caregivers, staff and the young people themselves to help the students develop their skills and knowledge to ensure positive futures within the wider community.

We have high expectations for these students, as with all Hillmorton students.

Priorities for enrolment:

To be eligible for enrolment into The Upland Specialist Programme, a student must be verified for ORS.

Each year the Board will identify the number of spaces available in the programme for the following year. If there are places available, the Board will publish this information by way of a notice in a daily or community newspaper and on the school website. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which applications must be received.

If there are more applicants than places, the Board will offer places by way of a ballot. If there are more applicants in a priority group than there are places available, places must be allocated in priority order until a category is reached where the number of spaces available in that category is insufficient to accommodate the number of eligible students. Selection within that priority group must be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G (1) of the Education Act 1989.

Places will be allocated to students in the following order:

- Those who live within the home zone, or are already enrolled at the school
- Those who live within the geographic catchment of Waitaha Special School
- Those who have previously attended a special school or specialised programme
- All other applicants

Where there are more applicants than spaces, the ballot will be used to establish a waiting list for vacancies that may arise during the year.

Applicants who live out-of-zone and do not secure a place in the special programme will enter the selection process for places at the school on the same basis as other out-of-zone students (unless the parents advise they do not wish to apply for places outside of the special programme).

## Out of Zone Enrolments

Applications for enrolments will be processed in the [following order of priority](#):

1. **First priority** must be given to students who have been accepted for enrolment in the Special Programme (Upland Specialist Programme) run by the school and approved by the Secretary for Education.
2. **Second priority** must be given to any applicant who is the sibling of a current student of the school.

3. **Third priority** must be given to any student who is the sibling of a former student of the school.
4. **Fourth priority** must be given to any applicant who is the child of a former student of the school.
5. **Fifth priority** must be given to any applicant who is a child of an employee of the school's board or a child of a member of the school's board.
6. **Sixth priority** must be given to all other applicants.

Before the application deadline associated with each pre-enrolment period, a Board must, by public notice in a medium appropriate to the area served by the school:

- confirm the already advertised dates for the receipt of applications and for the holding of the ballot.
- state the likely number of out of zone places that remain available.

If there are more applicants in any priority group than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by ballot conducted in accordance with [instructions by the Secretary](#), under [Schedule 20, Clause 3 \(1\)](#) of the Education and Training Act 2020. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by public notice in a medium appropriate to the area served by the school.

**Applicants may be required to give proof of In Zone address, or proof to support their application if seeking enrolment under the Out of Zone priorities.**

The guidelines for development and operation of enrolment schemes are issued under Schedule 20, Clause 3 (3) of the Education and Training Act 2020 for the purpose of describing the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.
